
What can an ESD do for YOU?


- Help set realistic management objectives by identifying the range of potential states for a given ecological site.

- Suggest potential management strategies with effectiveness of different practices on specific ecological sites and states.



 It provides a visual tool (Road Map)to communicate ecosystem dynamics to the andowner, permittees, agency employees and across agencies








1-Shortleaf/Post Oak Woodland




1-Shortleaf/Post Oak Woodland




2-Shortleaf/Post Oak Forest & Dense Shrub


