

Dr. Fred C. Bryant

Dr. Bryant has provided exceptional service to the Society for Range Management and the profession of range management since 1974. Few people have been as dedicated to the advancement of the Society and even fewer have been as effective. He served continuously in a leadership role from 1977 through 1996. He did an outstanding job as president of the Texas Section in 1991 and of the parent Society in 1995. During this time, he has served on numerous committees.



He has not only provided leadership in the profession but made major contributions in range and wildlife ruminant research. In the process of research, teaching and international projects he has made major contributions in grazing management. He has directed a ruminant project in Peru (10 years), Bolivia (5 years), and Morocco (2 years).

Dr. Bryant was recognized as an outstanding teacher and university administrator by Texas Tech University when he received the Institutions' Academic Achievement Award in 1989 and the Outstanding Alumnus Award in 1999. In addition to other awards, many of his students have gone on to take active leadership, research and education roles in the profession.

During Dr. Bryant's career, he has published 50 refereed publications in scientific journals, 75 technical papers, published one book and 3 book chapters. His research findings on ruminant nutrition, grazing management and livestock/wildlife relationships are used worldwide. He has truly served the Society with distinction; thus the Society is honored to present Dr. Fred Bryant with its Fellow Award.
