

Clive Gay, Emeritus Professor of Veterinary Clinical Sciences, College of Veterinary Medicine, Washington State University. Dr. Gay established the Field Disease Investigation Unit (FDIU) at WSU in 1982 after 21 years of teaching, practice and research large animal Veterinary Medicine in Canada, Great Britain, Australia, and the US. At the time, FDIU was unique in using a multi-disciplinary approach to utilize the skills of university and private veterinarians, animal and range scientists, extension agents, and ranchers to tackle Washington's veterinary challenges. Dr. Gay led the Field Disease Investigation Unit until his retirement in 2005. Dr. Gay has published on many diseases of agricultural animals; he is co-author of an internationally recognized text in large animal disease (now in its 10th edition) and a comprehensive explanatory veterinary dictionary (now in its 4th edition). He has received several national and international awards since his retirement in 2005. He continues a research interest in crooked calf disease.
