WHAT WE DO

Members of the Society for Range Management (SRM) represent diverse fields and interests worldwide and are involved in many aspects of rangeland science and management. Accordingly, the Society has a robust network of working projects, events, sections, committees, and interests. Below is a sample of current projects and opportunities underway with SRM:

Meetings and Events

Known for its exemplary meetings and conferences, SRM offers some of the best opportunities to interact with internationally-recognized rangeland professionals. The **SRM Annual Meeting** is renowned for its **networking** potential and outstanding opportunities for training and continuing education. Regional **SRM sections** also host meetings and rangeland tours throughout the year, allowing members easy access to networking in smaller settings.

Training Opportunities

SRM provides cutting edge, targeted training opportunities to its members both on a regional scale throughout the year and international scale at the Annual Meeting. SRM is currently working in partnership with federal agencies on the ground-breaking **Ecological Site Description (ESD)** workshop training program, which promotes the understanding and utility of ESDs and ESD development. Workshops are regionally-based and offer discounted registration rates to members of SRM. Training opportunities change regularly and the Society is continually discovering and developing opportunities to meet the **continuing education** and training needs of its members.

Targeted Forums

To meet the needs of a wide diversity of members and interests represented in the Society, SRM provides targeted training, forums, and events for specific demographics. These include the **Native Range Native American Forum**, focused on identifying training and mentorship capabilities between SRM and the Native American range community; the **Producers Forum**, specific to the production of livestock on rangelands; the **Young Professionals Conclave** for early-career professionals seeking support in the range field; a strong **International Affairs** committee, which provides travel assistance to meeting delegates; and many others. SRM and its volunteers provide multiple options to engage anyone with an interest in rangelands, and with over 30 different committees and task forces, there is a niche for everyone to get involved.

Certification Programs

SRM offers state-of-the-art certification programs to its members. These include the **Certified Range Management Consultant** program, designed to improve the effectiveness of range management and provide the best possible professional assistance; and the **Certified Professional in Rangeland Management** program, designed as a means of improving the standards of professional expertise used in managing public and private rangelands. SRM also offers **continuing education credits** for SRM professionals and assists members in the maintenance of their professional edge.

Resources

SRM members enjoy access to a multitude of resources and information. SRM produces two journals: **Rangelands**, a reader-friendly journal focused on the latest trends and policies in rangeland management, and **Rangeland Ecology & Management**, a peer-reviewed scientific journal publishing science, management, and policy information to support global rangeland stewardship. Additionally, SRM distributes relevant information to its members via **RangeFlash** emails, **Rangeland News** monthly newsletters, online through the **SRM website** and **social media**, and in-person at SRM meetings and events.
